GETTYSBURG BATTLEFIELD RESORT

A resort in the heart of Civil War history

Situated near the famous Mason-Dixon Line, the historic border between the old North and South, the Gettysburg Battlefield Resort in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, puts you in the midst of history. It's the area where President Abraham Lincoln dedicated a cemetery for the soldiers who fought in the battle of Gettysburg and uttered the words of his famous Gettysburg Address.

But you don't have to use the resort as a jumping off place for nearby activities. You can also use it as a destination resort with all your needs wrapped up within its borders. A variety of RV sites are available including pull-through and shaded. Relax in the authentic farmhouse lodge. Access the climatecontrolled bathhouses. Buy what you may have left behind at the general store. Need a snack? Visit the snack bar with hand-dipped Hershey's ice cream.

Get wet or just relax by the Olympic-size swimming pool or catch and release at the stocked fishing lake. Take a hike on a number of nature trails. Play shuffleboard, beach volleyball, horseshoes, corn hole, and arcade. If you traveled without your rig, rent one of the modern cabins. If you do choose to drive offsite, visit the nearby Gettysburg National Military Park. Often referred to as the "High Water Mark of the Rebellion," Gettysburg was the Civil War's bloodiest battle. The Soldiers' National Cemetery at Gettysburg is the final resting place for many of the Union soldiers who were

killed at the Battle of Gettysburg. The cemetery was dedicated on November 19, 1863, when President Abraham Lincoln delivered the "Gettysburg Address." Paved avenues provide the visitor with a quiet place to contemplate the sacrifice of so many Americans.

Just a short drive away is the home of world-famous Hershey chocolate in Hershey, Pennsylvania. Today it's also home to Hershey Park, Hershey's Chocolate World, and Zoo America.

The Lincoln Train Museum features more than 1,000 model trains from many countries, dioramas illustrating the role of the railroad during the Civil War and a simulated ride with President Lincoln to Gettysburg.
